

Let's learn about water

In Ireland, we bring 1.7 billion litres of clean safe drinking water to homes and businesses every single day. That's lots and lots of water that just doesn't fall straight from the sky to our taps, it needs to cleaned and treated so it is safe for everyone to drink.

We also take 1.6 billion litres of wastewater from toilets, sinks, showers, washing machines, dishwashers and from businesses and make sure this water is treated too before it goes back into our rivers, lakes and seas.

There are thousands of people working around the clock, in Local Authorities and in Irish Water to make sure that this all happens. It's a really big job.


Here are some activities for you to complete all about the Story of Water.



How does clean drinking water get to your tap?


Rain water from the clouds flows into rivers and lakes. From there it goes to the water treatment plant and then on to the reservoirs. This process involves 7 stages over 3 days (raw water, screening, sedimentation, filtration, disinfection, testing, and storage) to be made clean and safe to drink.



Water from our rivers and lakes is made clean and safe to drink at the water treatment plant. The clean water then goes through the water pipes underground, sometimes long distances, to our kitchen taps for us to drink and use at home.

Most of the 63,000 kilometres of water network in Ireland is under the ground. Some of our oldest pipes are over 150 years old and can be leaking. We are working to fix that.

Spot the 7 differences in these two images of water pipes under the ground.










How to save water

Water is precious, so it's important to not waste it. There are many ways that we can help save water.


The below images show ways of water being used. Match the sentences to the images, to show how water can be saved.





Ever wondered what happens when you flush?




