#### Significance of Results:

The WWTP was non-compliant with the ELV's set in the Wastewater Discharge Licence. There were 2 exceedances in relation to the Ammonia-N ELV, both of which were above the Condition 2 ELV. The impact on receiving water is assessed further in Section 2.3.

## 2.3 Ambient monitoring summary

#### 2.3.2 Ambient Monitoring Parameter Summary - Clara WWTP

The results for ambient results and / or additional monitoring data sets are included in the **Appendix 7.1 - Ambient Monitoring Summary.** 

#### Significance of Results:

The WWTP discharge was not compliant with the ELV's set in the wastewater discharge licence.

The ambient monitoring results meet the required EQS. Where the ambient monitoring results meets the EQS this relates to the Oxygenation and Nutrient Conditions set out in the Surface Water Regulations 2009. The discharge from the wastewater treatment plant do not have an observable impact on the water quality. The discharge from the wastewater treatment plant do not have an observable negative impact on the Water Framework Directive status. In terms of the drinking water abstractions downstream of the discharge (i.e. River Shannon drinking water abstraction 36.5 km d/s on River Shannon and Portumna drinking water abstraction 60km d/s in Lough Derg.) there is no evidence to suggest that the discharge from Clara is having an impact on these abstractions.

## 3 OPERATIONAL REPORTS SUMMARY

## 3.1 Treatment Efficiency Report

Treatment efficiency is based on the removal of key pollutants from the influent wastewater by the treatment plant. In essence the calculation is based on the balance of load coming into the plant versus the load leaving the plant. The efficiency is presented as a percentage removal rate.

A summary presentation of the efficiency of the treatment process including information for all the parameters specified in the licence is included below:

The discharge from the wastewater treatment plant does not have an observable negative impact on the water quality.

The discharge from the WWTP has no observable negative impact on the Water Framework Directive status.

In terms of the drinking water abstractions downstream of the discharge (i.e. River Shannon drinking water abstraction 36.5 km d/s on River Shannon and Portumna drinking water abstraction 60km d/s in Lough Derg.) there is no evidence to suggest that the discharge from Clara is having an impact on these abstractions.
