1 EXECUTIVE SUMMARY AND INTRODUCTION TO THE 2018 AER

This Annual Environmental Report has been prepared for D0257-01, Slane, in Meath in accordance with the requirements of the wastewater discharge licence for the agglomeration. Specified reports are included as an appendix to the AER as follows:

Cause of Exceedance(s):

WWTP not designed for P removal. Other exceedances were due to operational issues at the WWTP.

Significance of Results:

The WWTP was not compliant with the ELVs set in the Wastewater Discharge Licence. Seven samples exceeded the Ortho-P ELV, of which three exceeded the Condition 2 ELV. One sample exceeded the Ammonia N Condition 2 ELV. The impact on receiving waters is assessed further in Section 2.3.

2.3 Ambient monitoring summary

A summary of monitoring from ambient monitoring points associated with the wastewater discharge is provided in the sections below. For discharges to rivers upstream (U/S) and downstream (D/S) location data is provided. For other ambient points in lakes, coastal or transitional waters, monitoring data from the most appropriate monitoring station is selected.

Significance of Results:

The WWTP discharge was not compliant with the ELV's set in the wastewater discharge licence.

The ambient monitoring results meet the required EQS. Where the ambient monitoring results meets the EQS this relates to the Oxygenation and Nutrient Conditions set out in the Surface Water Regulations 2009.

The discharge from the wastewater treatment plant does not have an observable negative impact on the water quality.

The discharge from the WWTP has no observable negative impact on the Water Framework Directive status.

It is noted that consistent achievement with the ELVs would benefit the quality of the receiving water.

In terms of the drinking water abstractions downstream of the discharge (i.e. Groundwater abstraction 100m south west of SW001, surface water abstraction 7km downstream) there is no evidence to suggest that discharge from Slane is having an impact on these abstractions.

3 OPERATIONAL REPORTS SUMMARY

3.1 Treatment Efficiency Report

Treatment efficiency is based on the removal of key pollutants from the influent wastewater by the treatment plant. In essence the calculation is based on the balance of load coming into the plant versus the load leaving the plant. The efficiency is presented as a percentage removal rate.

A summary presentation of the efficiency of the treatment process including information for all the parameters specified in the licence is included below:
