

# Road Closure No 2 information for Glen Road/Sand Quay 16 September 2019 to 20 October 2019.

## HOMES ADJACENT TO ROAD CLOSURE

### What happens next?

These road closure applications are expected to be advertised by Cork County Council in the Examiner Friday 16<sup>th</sup> August. It is expected that Cork County Council will invite submissions on these closures as part of the statutory road closure application process.

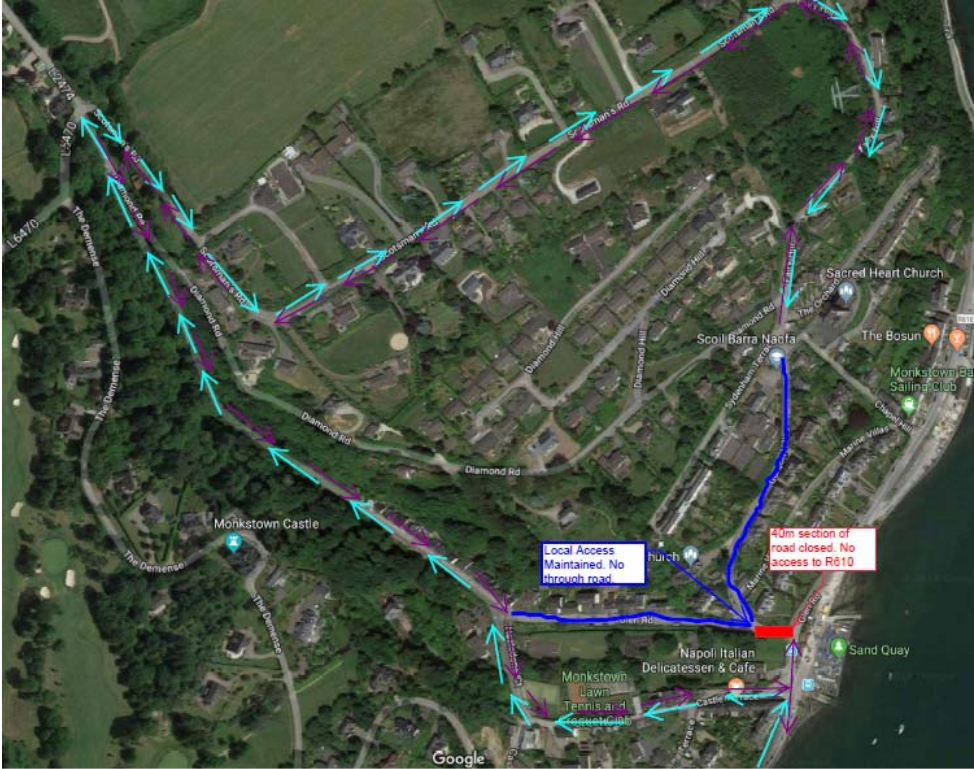
Cork County Council, being the relevant Roads Authority, will then consider the application and all relevant submissions and either seek further information from the applicant or grant the road closure. Should Cork County Council grant the application for a road closure, they will publish the dates of the road closure.

### Will I be informed if the road closure is going ahead?

Yes, should the road closure licences be granted, we will notify you by letter.

### Will I be able to access my home?

Yes, access will be maintained to your home at all times. A diversion will be in place where traffic will be diverted to Castle Terrace / Castle Road, parallel to Glen Road. We will accommodate all special access requirements during this phase of the works.



### **What about parking?**

There will be some limited restrictions to parking. Alternative parking arrangements will be in place. We will communicate exact details directly to those affected.

### **How do I access the village?**

Pedestrian access will be available at all times. Traffic will be diverted via Castle Terrace / Castle Road.

### **Will the Emergency Services be able to access my home?**

The emergency services will be notified of the road closure, with maps provided allowing them to manage their response should an emergency arise. Emergency services manage road closures on a regular basis. They will include the road closure information into their dispatching protocol. They will determine how best to deploy a service, be it an ambulance, fire truck or Garda car. The road closure will not impact the quality of service being provided by the Emergency services.

### **Will refuse collection services be able to access the area?**

Yes. All refuse companies will be notified of the road closure, with maps provided, allowing them to plan their route accordingly. Should there be any issue with your refuse collection, please contact the OCU Community Liaison Officer, Michelle Crotty, on (087) 721 4133 and it will be looked after.

### **Will I be able to access doctors/church/post office/pharmacy/shops/ferry?**

All footpaths and pedestrian access will remain open throughout the closure, and road will be diverted via Castle Terrace / Castle Road.

### **What are the working hours?**

8am – 6pm

### **Will the services to my house such as water, gas, electricity be affected?**

No, there are no planned interruptions to services as part of the works. All service diversions will be as per previous communications.
